POLICY ON CONTINUING COMPETENCE IN NEONATAL RESUSCITATION

Registered midwives with an active-practising (clinical) or provisional (clinical) license must annually complete The Canadian Pediatric Society's Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP) course which must be based on the most current edition of the Neonatal Resuscitation Program, with skills required for a primary care provider and applicable within the midwifery scope of practice.

Registrants must have successfully attended and completed the NRP training course provided by a CPS NRP Instructor in the 12-month period prior to application for initial registration or registration renewal.

A member with NRP Instructor status must have taught the CPS NRP Advanced course, all levels at least once with the 12-month period prior to application for initial registration or renewal.
